



Guest house repair:

In order to establish a sustainable income for the local community, the Meto project is to repair an existing guest house for visitors to the community.

The building needs a new roof and it needs to be fully painted and furnished inside.

In time the Meto community would like to be able to put a passive solar water heating system onto the roof.

This house will have three bedrooms, a shower, a kitchen and living room. The building is already on the site, but has fallen into disrepair.

The Meto project manager on site will appoint a member of the community to be in charge of bookings, cleaning and upkeep maintenance of the guest house.

People who will pay to use the guest house will include: people travelling between the Rift Valley and Namanga (Tanzanian Border Crossing), visiting members of the Diocese of Kajiado, and volunteers from Minerex.
